New cruise ships are built year after year, becoming bigger and better as par for the course. We, however, have decided to stay small and beautiful: The two hand-sailed windjammers SEA CLOUD and SEA CLOUD II cruise in the world's finest sailing waters, while our river yacht RIVER CLOUD II sails along the most beautiful rivers in the heart of Europe. On the following pages we would like to present to you the colourful programmes for winter 2012/2013 for both tall ships, and also give you an outlook on future voyages for 2013 on all three yachts.

The winter draws our windjammers to where the sun enjoys shining: to idyllic harbours, original Maya states, snorkelling paradises and popular meeting places for sailors in the Lesser Antilles, Cuba and Central America. The ship's course guides you through the Panama Canal to Costa Rica and Panama from one pristine natural paradise to the next and to fantastic national parks. Hikes in the forest canopy, river and boat trips offer deep insights into an unknown world. In spring 2013 they sail back to the western and eastern Mediterranean. SEA CLOUD II will also visit the Azores, Northern Europe and the Atlantic coast. And as a special highlight both windjammers will sail around the Canaries on a common course before returning to their warm winter quarters.

RIVER CLOUD II revives the former elegance and style of travel and re-discovers the true relaxation of a slower pace. During 2013, it applies to the Dutch and Belgian waterways and along the Rhine, Main, Moselle and Danube: not only for culture and history, but also for recreation and the joy of discovery. Visit the fascinating cities of Amsterdam, Budapest and Vienna, and the idyllic landscapes of the Danube delta, the Wachau region or the IJsselmeer. Wonderful sailing and ideal trade winds The perfect wind conditions that can be found between the south-lying Lesser Antilles and Central America in winter make a tall ship cruise on the SEA CLOUD a unique experience with many magnificent hours out at sea.

Visit two of the ABC islands: Aruba und Curaçao

Aruba and Curaçao make up the A and C of the ABC islands and belong to the Kingdom of the Netherlands. Their distinctive features – including delft tiles, Dutch gable houses, palms and the pastel colours of the Caribbean – make this an enchanting destination. Costa Rica's Pacific coast: perfect sailing waters

The Pacific coast is blessed with an abundance of natural beauty, reliable winds, outstanding anchorages, lush green coasts and radiant sunshine. Columbus named Costa Rica "La Huerta", or "the garden", and the name is just as fitting today as it was back then.

The volcanic interior

Deep crater lakes and blue lagoons set against a barren landscape: the volcanic regions of Costa Rica reveal a completely different side to this otherwise immensely colourful country. In the Valle Central, the most fertile of the country's valleys, the natural bounty takes a particularly aromatic form with the extensive coffee plants.

The unique national parks

The SEA CLOUD brings you to the region's widely spread national parks using the best possible route - the sea. Water birds can be spotted on boat trips through the mangroves in the Palo Verde National Park; the Carara National Park marks the transition from tropical rainforest to dry forest; the blossom in the Pura Vida Gardens offers a veritable rapture of colours; and early risers in the Manuel Antonio Park will be rewarded with once-in-a-lifetime sightings of the indigenous animal population.

Brigitte Fugger, marine biologist, ecologist, and ornithologist, has led over 150 research voyages. She has worked as a lecturer in tropical ecology and a birdsong expert. She now spends most of her time writing nature guides and producing wildlife films, and frequently works as an on-board lecturer.

Granada - a UNESCO World Heritage Site

With around 400 islands, Lake Nicaragua is the second largest lake in Latin America. On its banks lies the colonial town of Granada. The many sights of the country's oldest city can be easily discovered on foot. With all its magnificent Spanish facades, cathedrals and monasteries, the Old Town, which surrounds a beautifully designed park, is a romantic and fabulously restored treasure.

Unique national parks and gardens

Explore the narrow pathways through the rainforest of the Manuel Antonio National Park and discover its menagerie of indigenous animals. Or take a boat trip through the Palo Verde National Park to discover the water birds nestling between the mangroves. The world's second largest coral reef

Mayan cities in Mexico and Belize

There are many fascinating facts about the Mayans, a civilisation that dominated Central America for centuries. Stone ruins stand as testament to their way of life at important sites such as Altun Ha, the former city of Lamanai which lies buried in the jungle, and the famous fort of Tulum, the only coastal Mayan settlement.

Beach lovers, sun worshippers and snorkellers will keep Isla de la Juventud and Maria la Gorda forever in their minds. These beaches are practically untouched and are still considered an insider tip.

Trinidad's Old Town

Trinidad de Cuba is a small, friendly place with a long history as the hub of the sugar cane farming industry. Its enchanting location directly on the sea, lovingly restored facades and gentle pace of life can be easily enjoyed in one of the town's beautiful squares or by exploring the narrow historical alleyways. This small town has a well-deserved place on the UNESCO World Heritage list.

Vibrant Cuban music

If Cuba is the birthplace for almost every style of Latin-American dance, then Santiago de Cuba is the stage. Nowhere else will you find as much live music or as much dancing. In the town's clubs, bars and schools you will find salsa, son and rumba rhythms that are just as thrilling as in the world-famous Buena Vista Social Club. A band will also perform on board.

The natural beauty spots of St Lucia and Dominica

The pitons of St Lucia are world famous and magnificently beautiful. But perhaps even more beautiful is the unique view you have of this stunning natural masterpiece from the SEA CLOUD's anchorage. Dominica is one of the wildest and most primal of the Lesser Antilles. The heart of the island is covered in thick virgin forest, where you will find plunging rivers and small creeks winding their way through the jungle.

Bequia and the Tobago Cays – a haunt for sailors

The small town of Port Elizabeth on Bequia is a place for sailors to meet and catch up, either on the local beach or in front of the town's small bars. The small archipelago of the Tobago Cays offers protected anchorages in its lagoons – beach heaven awaits you!

Snorkeler's paradise in the Tobago Cays

A unique feature of the Tobago Cays is its pristine coral reef, christened the "Horseshoe Reef" due to its shape. It keeps the Atlantic swells away and is the perfect place to go snorkelling. Once you are back on dry land, you will be treated to a beach barbecue with culinary delights.

French style on the Îles des Saintes

Although the Isles of Saints make an extremely welcoming impression, the sight of the historical Fort Napoleon towering over the main island is a reminder of less peaceful times. This small town's promenade is perfect for taking a stroll and enjoying the sense of "savoir vivre" against the backdrop of the glowing pastel colours of the Caribbean.

The C of the ABC islands: Curaçao

The coastal waters of Curaçao are a marine conservation area and its small capital, Willemstad, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site with a lush natural setting, swaying palm trees, beaches, art galleries, and historical buildings that have been lovingly restored.
